

How do I get my Scout's Uniform and Materials?

Lions (Scouts currently enrolled in kindergarten) use a t-shirt as their uniform that the Pack provides. Lions do not need to purchase a Class A uniform.

The Class A uniform is a blue or khaki button-down shirt with patches, a hat, a Neckerchief, and a Cub Scout belt.

Most Packs do not require official BSA pants or socks. We just ask that all Scouts and adult leaders wear their shirts tucked into solid, dark blue pants with the official Cub Scout belt.

You do not need to re-purchase anything from the list that your Scout already has.

You can purchase uniforms and materials in person at the Seattle Trading Post

Purchasing the uniform in person is ***strongly*** encouraged and advised because shirt sizes may be hard to predict without trying them on.

What shirt should I get my Scout?

Remember that your Scout may wear the shirt for several years. 1st or 2nd grade Scouts are encouraged to buy a size they will grow into.

You should buy a Lion t-shirt if your Scout is:

1. Entering kindergarten



You should buy a blue BSA shirt if your Scout is:

1. Entering 1st, 2nd, or 3rd grade

You should buy a khaki shirt with blue shoulder loops if your Scout is:

1. Entering 4th Grade and does not have or has outgrown the blue shirt
2. Entering 5th Grade

If your Scout is entering 4th grade, but still has a blue shirt from last year that still fits, you have the option to keep using it.



What patches do I need for my Scout's shirt?

If you do not know your Scout's Pack and Den number, ask Your Den Leader, Cubmaster, or Assistant Cubmaster

Shirts sold at the Seattle Trading Post may already have some of these patches.

Lion (kindergarten) t-shirts do not have patches.

Patches:

1. Council Shoulder Patch



2. Council Rounder (not available online)



3. Den Number



4. Pack Number

6. 1910 World Crest Ring

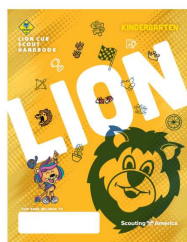

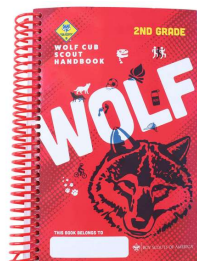

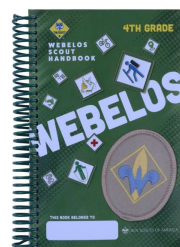

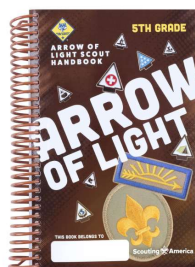

Where do all these patches go?

Don't worry about the extra awards, patches, and pins in these photos. You Scout will have plenty of those soon enough.

Note the blue shoulder loops and the Webelos colors on the khaki shirt. Both 4th and 5th grade Webelos should have the colors on the right sleeve, even if the Scout is a 4th grader continuing to use a blue shirt. 5th graders should always be in a khaki shirt.



How do I attach all these patches?

You can sew them on. Most people use Badge Magic. Although it is suggested that if you use Badge Magic you still put a stitch in each corner of the Chief Seattle Council shoulder patch as the corners tend to pull away from the curved sleeve.
